Market Rules not always drives to perfect competition

- Some potential risks
 - For-profit not interested on those don't have money
 - Speculative practices
 - Abuse of dominant position
- **VERY SMART** regulations might be necessary
 - Enough to mitigate all risks?

Just in Case... Remove obstacles

- 1) Increase diversity, alternatives to the pure-for-profit
 - Recognize alternatives, Bottom-up-Broadband, DIY, Community Networks
- 2) Collaboration with public administration & municipalities
 - Bypass restrictions to the municipalities by collaboration agreements with those entities
 - Still meeting the requirements for neutrality, openness, ...
 - So an alleged "alteration" of the market can no longer be claimed, but a successful market rules should include alternatives and inclusion of public interests and not-for-profit driven initiatives.
